


Vision

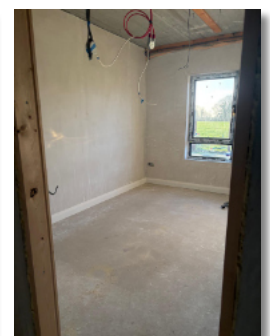


Update on the Building

The sanitary ware will be fitted very soon. Likewise, our kitchen is also ready to be fitted out any time now that the doorway and hatch has been completed into the dining room. New windows have been installed in the counselling rooms and the plastering has been completed in them, as well as many of the other rooms within the annex.

All in all, work continues to progress and we are excited to see each new stage.

New Volunteers

My name is Chontelle Turner, and I first became acquainted with Stauros back in 2017 when I contacted them for help for my brother, who was battling a heavy addiction to alcohol. Little did I know back then, that only a few years later I would be needing that same help and support myself.

In 2021 I found myself drinking regularly just to cope with everyday life, and I began drinking more and more which often led to a few days of binges. Things finally came to a head after a very bad fall, in which I knocked myself unconscious. It was then that I finally realised I had a serious problem and reached out to Stauros for help.

Alcohol was always a big problem in our family, and I lost both my parents and sadly my brother due to it. I have no doubt whatsoever, that if I hadn't have reached out for help when I did, I would not be here today either!

I have been free from alcohol now for over 4 years, and I decided to become a volunteer for Stauros because it is both my passion and desire to offer others the same help and support I was given, and to see people like me, liberated and walking in the freedom that Jesus Christ so graciously paid for on the cross.

My name is Ryan Dawson, and I'm from Ballymena. I first came to know the Stauros Foundation in 2023 when I met Roy, who walked with me through my journey out of a fourteen-year dependence on prescription drugs. Through the support of Stauros, the guidance of Roy, and the help of Teen Challenge, I am grateful to be celebrating fourteen months in recovery. I now volunteer with Stauros and I'm part of Green Pastures Church in Ballymena.

Since returning home from Teen Challenge, I believe God has given me a deep compassion for the broken and addicted, and through my own life experience, I hope to offer others a glimpse of the same hope I received. I look forward to God using me, even in a small way, to support others on their path to recovery.

My name is Michelle Bradley, and I have recently joined the Stauros family as a volunteer. My journey with Stauros began during a difficult time, when a close family member was struggling with addiction. During that season I got support from Stauros, as did my loved one; the gentleness, understanding and prayerful presence offered, made a deep impact on me, as at that time, it was one of the few ways I could see and feel God's love.

Addiction is all consuming, it not only affects the person struggling but often the whole family. It affects every part of life, planning becomes difficult, relationships get stained, friends and even other family members, unsure of how to respond, drift away. The support I received from Stauros became invaluable to me.

Because of my own experience, I believe the Lord has given me compassion for others walking a similar path. He has really put it on my heart to serve those struggling with addiction and in particular families who are affected by it. Having experienced the frustration, loneliness and fear that addiction brings to families, I hope to offer empathy, friendship, prayer and a listening ear to those who feel overwhelmed or alone.
